SALLE YOO is the General Counsel of Uber Technologies, Inc. where she leads the legal and regulatory functions for the company. Prior to joining Uber, Yoo was a Partner with Davis Wright Tremaine LLP in its San Francisco office, where she represented leading energy, telecommunication, and technology companies in regulatory and litigation matters.

Yoo is a board member and Secretary of the Asian American Bar Association (AABA) of the Greater Bay Area. She has also served as Co-Chair of AABA's Judiciary Committee, where she worked with the committee to increase diversity on California's state and federal courts. She is a prior President of the Korean American Bar Association of Northern California and the Korean American Chamber of Commerce of the North Pacific Coast. She currently serves on the Museum Council for the Asian Art Museum, through which she pursues her interest in arts education for children and support of Asian American artists. She also serves on the Audit Committee for the Museum. She has served on the Citizens' Advisory Committee for the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency, and as a Delegate to the California State Bar's Conferences of Delegates.

Yoo is a graduate of Scripps College and Boston University School of Law. She lives in San Francisco with her family.



JOAN M. HARATANI is a Partner in Morgan Lewis' Litigation Practice. Haratani has an extensive trial and pretrial practice, with an emphasis on complex commercial and product liability disputes. She has expertise in complex licensing agreements and trade secret indemnity issues and has served as co-lead counsel on some of the largest mass tort litigations in the nation, as well as the largest pending class actions of which she obtained a dismissal at the federal court level (affirmed by the ninth circuit).

Haratani is recognized as one of the "Top 100 Lawyers in California" and as a "Top 75 Women Litigator" by the *Daily Journal*. She is the Recent Past President of the Bar Association of San Francisco (BASF), the first female of color president of BASF in its then 134-year history. She is also a past President of the Asian American Bar Association of the Greater Bay Area, past Regional Governor of the National Asian Pacific American Bar Association, past Co-Chair of the Committee in the ABA Science and Technology Section, and a past Chair of The Asian Pacific Fund. Haratani served as Chair of the Bar Association/Law Firm section of the State Bar of California's Inaugural Pipeline Task Force.

Haratani has received numerous awards for both her practice accomplishments and service on behalf of women and minority practitioners. She is a recipient of the ABA's Spirit of Excellence Award, the Anti Defamation League's Distinguished Jurisprudence Award, and the Thurgood Marshall Award. Haratani has also received the Asian American Bar Association of the Greater Bay Area's award for "Exceptional Legal Advocacy."

Haratani is admitted to practice in California and before the state and federal courts of California. She earned a J.D. from the University of California, Davis School of Law and a B.A. from St. John's College in Santa Fe, New Mexico.
