

Carrie J. Fletcher

**Affiliate Instructor, Harvard Law School Executive Education;
Sloan Fellow, London Business School**



Carrie J. Fletcher is currently based in London, England, where she is working on an M.Sci. degree in the London Business School's elite Sloan Leadership & Strategy program. She is one of only 60 global business executives selected as Sloan Fellows. Fletcher is also an Affiliate Instructor at Harvard Law School's Executive Education program (HLSEE), where she works with faculty law firm/legal department clients to develop customized leadership programs serving law firm managing partners, emerging law firm leaders, and general counsel from across the globe.

Prior to her admission to the Sloan program, Fletcher was the immediate past executive director of HLSEE, ran the business operations of the Executive Education (Exec Ed) department, and taught in the HLS Exec Ed programs. She continues to teach with HLS Exec Ed, speaks and teaches at conferences, and works privately with law firms to develop and deliver tailored leadership programming to their attorneys at all levels of seniority. Fletcher does a significant amount of diversity-related leadership development work, including designing and teaching in programs for the Leadership Council on Legal Diversity.

Before joining HLS Executive Education, Fletcher was the executive director of Law Programs at the Fullbridge Program, where she designed curricula focused on professional and business skills development for lawyers, and managed ongoing and new relationships with law firms. Prior to her time at Fullbridge, Fletcher spent 18 years in both practicing and business-side roles at large law firms. From 2007-2013, she was a member of the Professional Development & Training team at Goodwin Procter LLP, where she created and implemented programming for partners and associates that focused on leadership development, core professional skills instruction, substantive legal skills training, and assessment and implementation of diversity initiatives. She practiced complex commercial and soft intellectual property litigation from 1996-2007, initially in Chicago, and then at Foley & Lardner's Boston office for the last nine years of that period.

Fletcher received her J.D. from the University of Michigan Law School (December 1995) and her B.A. (April 1993, with distinction) from the University of Michigan.
