**KRISTEN CAMPBELL** is Executive Vice President and General Counsel for Hilton. She joined the company in June 2011 and is responsible for leading Hilton's global legal and compliance functions.

Prior to Hilton, Campbell was senior vice president, general counsel, and corporate secretary of Staples, Inc., a \$25 billion international office products company.

While in this role she gained experience in board work and corporate governance, regulatory compliance, M&A, commercial transactions, litigation, real estate, and labor and employment, in both the U.S. domestic and international arenas.

Prior to joining Staples, Inc. in 1993, Campbell worked at law firms Goodwin Procter and Rackemann, Sawyer & Brewster.

Campbell is a member of the Board of Directors of Office Depot, Inc., and is also a board member of Vital Voices Global Partnership. She is a member of the Massachusetts and Virginia bars.

**DANIEL P. MOYLAN** is Co-Managing Partner of Venable. He has extensive experience representing companies in financial services and complex commercial litigation, special litigation committees and boards of directors in the conduct of investigations under Delaware, New York, and Maryland law, and representing individuals, personally and as trustees, in Trusts and Estate and other private wealth litigation.

Moylan is a past president of the Maryland Defense Counsel, Inc., an organization of 750+ Maryland

litigators whose practices are limited to defending individuals and businesses against lawsuits. Previously, while serving as the MDC's Legislative Chair, Moylan organized and coordinated opposition to legislation that would eliminate the Economic Damages Cap in Maryland and shift Maryland law from Contributory Negligence to Comparative Negligence. He has also served on the Pro Bono Committee of the Community Law Center.

Moylan is admitted to practice in Maryland, and before the Federal District Court for The District of Maryland and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia. He earned his J.D., *cum laude*, University of Maryland School of Law in 1995 and a B.A. from University of Richmond in 1992. Moylan clerked for the Honorable Arrie W.
